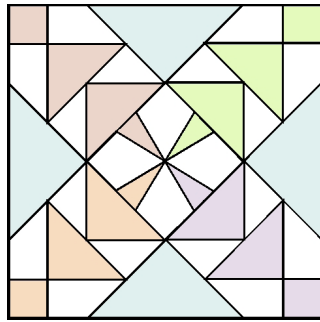


Lizard block by Marjorie Rhine

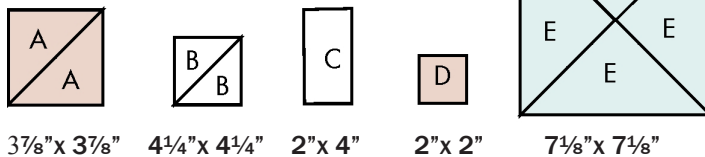

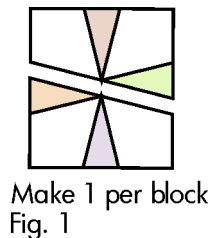
Cutting for one 12" block:

Assorted colored scraps - 8A, 4D, foundation piecing
 Light print - 8B, 8C, foundation piecing
 Light blue - 4E



Making the block

Make 2 copies of the foundation for Section X (for your convenience, two copies are provided to the right). Following the coloring and numbers on the foundation, paper piece 2 Section X. Join the 2 sections (fig.1) and remove the paper. Press seam allowances in one direction.



Following figure 2, join 2 B patches to an A, join a C to an A, and join a D to a C. Press seam allowances in the direction of the arrows. Join the three sections. Using a rotary cutter and ruler, trim the portions of C patches that extend beyond the sides of the lizard unit (fig. 3). Make 4, coordinating colored patches in each unit as you go.

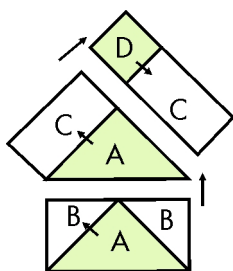
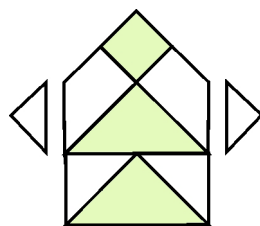
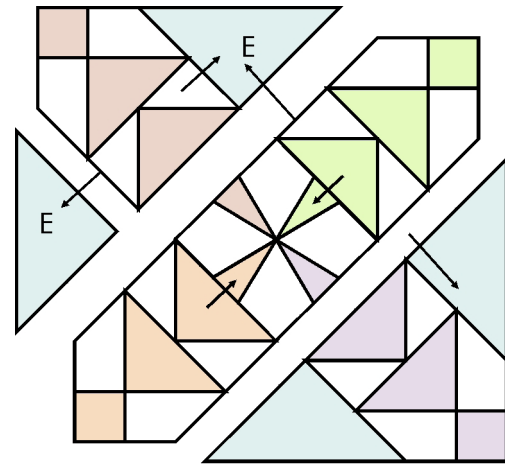

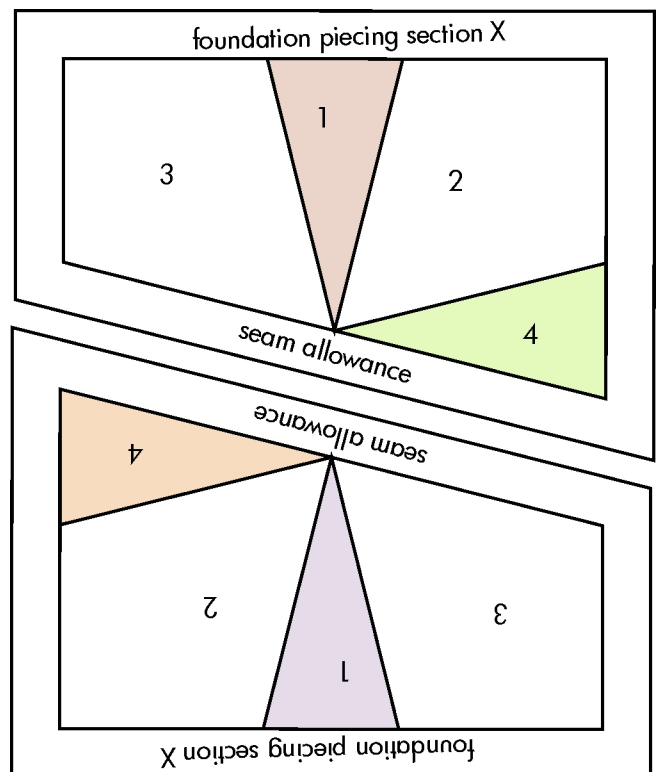


Make 4 per block

Following the Block assembly diagram, sew a lizard unit to each side of the paper pieced unit. Press seam allowances in the direction of the arrows. Sew an E patch to each side of the remaining lizard units. Join the three units to make a block.
