

Bonus Patch Duck 6" Block

Cutting for one block:

Duck Fabric:	Background Fabric:
One 1½" x 4¾" (D1)	One 1⅛" x 6½" (B1)
One 2¾" x 2¼" (D2)	One 1¾" x 4¾" (B2)
One 2¾" x 1¾" (D3)	One 2⅛" x 4¼" (B3)
	One 1¼" x 2¾" (B4)
Feet & Bill:	One 1½" x 2¼" (B5)
Three 1½" x 1½" (F1)	Two 1½" x 2" (B6)
	One 1½" x 1¾" (B7)
Wing Fabric:	Two 1½" x 1½" (B8)
Two 2¼" x 2¼" (W1)	One ¾" x ¾" (B9)
Green Fabric:	
One 1" x 6½" (G1)

Sewing Tips:

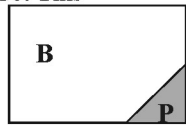
- Sew all seams with an accurate 1/4" seam allowance. Test your seam allowance before starting a project.

- Groupings of patches to make a unit of the block are shown on the 'exploded' block pattern on the previous page. Dashed lines, if present, show which units to then sew together before sewing all into the finished block.

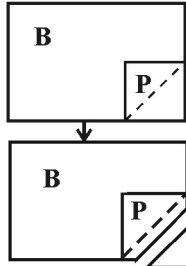
- Sew-and-Fold Patches

All patches in this block are precut as squares and rectangles. Triangles and odd shaped patches in the block are made using a technique I call Sew-and-Fold. Following the pictures to the right, the pattern diagram will show the patch letters of the rectangle and square used to make triangles. The square is placed over the corner of the rectangle, right sides together, then it is stitched across the diagonal. Both rectangle and square are trimmed 1/4" from the sewing line and the seam is pressed.

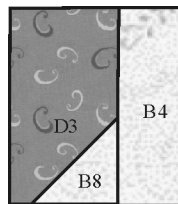

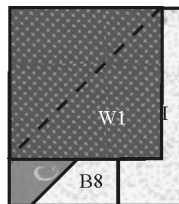
More complex shapes can be made using multiple Sew-and-Fold patches in the same unit. This example shows how to sew the back wing unit of Patch Duck (see block layout on previous page - not reverse block). Patch B8 is sewn to D3 using Sew-and-Fold technique described above.



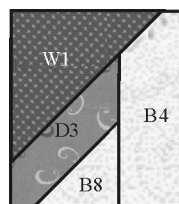
Patch B4 is added to the unit.



Again using Sew-and-Fold technique, position patch W1 over corner of the pieced rectangle, right sides together, and stitch from corner to corner.

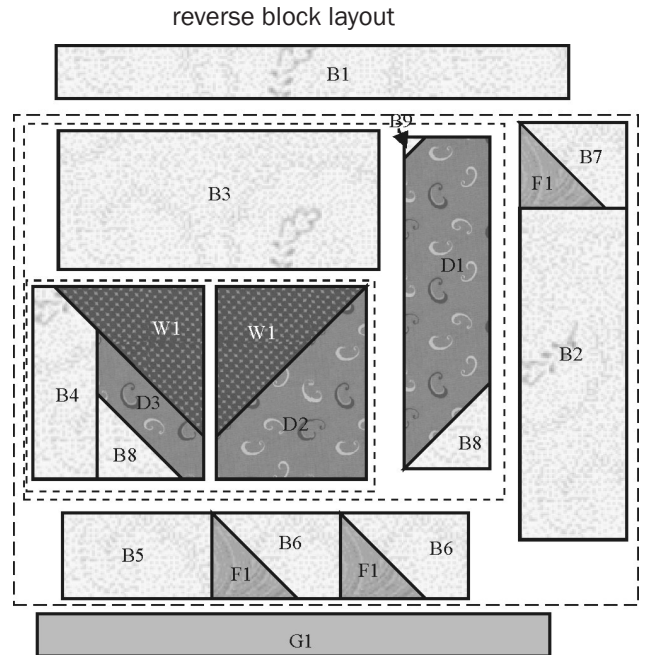


Trim and press.



Other info:

- Add eyes and other facial features as desired by applique, embroidery, or by drawing on the fabric with a fabric marking pen. Some Patch Pattern animals show suggested facial features on the pattern cover.



- A reverse Duck block can be stitched following the block layout above.

-Fabric requirements for one block, 12 blocks and 20 blocks are given on the back of the pattern. Instructions for sewing these blocks together into a quilt are not included. The finished block measures 12" so you can use any instructions for making a quilt from 12" blocks to put this quilt together.
